
I can describe how some plants and animals are suited to different habitats.



- 1. Plants and animals that live in the desert need to survive without much water because the deserts are very dry.
- 2. The only plants that can grow in the Arctic region are grass and mosses. Trees can't grow here because the ground stays frozen all year round.
- 3. Lots of animals in the rainforest live high up in the trees where there is plenty of food.
- 4. There are more than 21,000 species of fish in the ocean. Fish breathe underwater using special organs called gills.

Micro- habitat	A very small habitat like under a rock
